Banking Commission Names Sean Miller as Chief Information Officer

Banking Commissioner Charles G. Cooper today announced the Texas Department of Banking has hired Sean Miller as Chief Information Officer (CIO) effective January 13, 2020.

As CIO, Mr. Miller will provide direction and guidance for the daily operations and long-range planning needs of the Department's Information Technology Division. He is responsible for establishing priorities and standards, implementing programs, and applying appropriate resources to meet agency goals, coordinating and assessing program activities, and developing and evaluating division budgets.

Mr. Miller brings to the Department two decades of experience in state government, specifically in the areas of information technology and information security. He spent the previous seven years with the Texas Railroad Commission, first as Assistant Information Technology Division Director and later as Chief Information Security Officer.

Prior to joining the Railroad Commission, Mr. Miller served with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality from 2010 to 2013 as Enterprise Support Section Manager and with the Texas Youth Commission as Director of Network, Communications, and Support Operations from 2003 to 2010. His previous work experience also includes a series of technical or supervisory positions with the Texas Youth Commission and Texas Department of Protective and Regulatory Services.

A 1994 graduate of Saint Edward's University in Austin, where he majored in Photocommunications, Mr. Miller holds the industry accreditations of Certified Information Security Manager and Certified Information Security Officer.

"Mr. Miller's significant information technology experience makes him a valuable addition to the Department's management team," Commissioner Cooper said. "His expertise will be a major asset as we continue to build upon the agency's information technology and security environment."
